Abstract (in one of the working languages of the Conference - Serbian, Hungarian, Slovakian, Romanian, Ruthenian, Croatian, and in English; if the paper is written in English, the abstract must also be in Serbian), up to 1000 characters (with spaces), with a clearly stated goal of the research, methodology, the principal results and major conclusions (Times New Roman, font size: 10, line spacing: 1,5).

Key words: up to five key words.

1. Heading 1 (Times New Roman, font size: 12, line spacing: 1,5)

For publication in the Proceedings of the Conference should be submitted exclusively original papers that have not been previously published or offered for publication elsewhere. **Articles should be correct in terms of spelling, grammar, style and proofread, prepared in accordance with the style sheet. Contributions that do not meet the criteria will not be taken into consideration.**

The minimum length of the paper is 29000, and the maximum is 35000 characters, including abstract and literature. It is desirable that the paper contains auto-citations (up to 2), 1,5 spaced justified lines, in any of the following languages: English, Serbian, Romanian, Croatian, Hungarian, Slovakian and Ruthenian), in accordance with Chicago Manual of Style (Author-Date Style):

In this system, sources are briefly cited in the text, usually in parentheses, by author's last name and year of publication (Petrović 2015, 31). Each in-text citation matches up with an entry in a reference list, where full bibliographic information is provided.

* Please indicate whether paper is done as a part of a project or indicate another acknowledgement.

Quotations not longer than four lines should run **with the text**. Please use the quotation marks appropriate to the language the paper is written in. **Longer quotations** should be formatted as a **separate paragraph, without quotation marks**:

Quotation (New paragraph, font size: 11, line spacing: 1,5, before and after text, without quotation marks) text text text text (Grazer and Fisherman 2015, 12-16).

Author`s comments should be written in **footnotes**.

Footnotes should be numbered consecutively. Authors should use automatic numbering for footnotes, using the option References > Footnotes > Insert Footnote in MS Word (Times New Roman, font size: 10, line spacing: 1,5).

Tables and **charts** should be submitted in Word file, numbered and identified by number and by title. Title should be placed underneath and centralized:

Figures should be submitted as separate file. The resolution of files should be at least 300 dpi. Please make sure that the quality of the image is suitable for publication. Do not place images in Word file, but only indicate the placement of each illustration: *Figure 1* - about here. Authors are responsible for obtaining permission to use copyrighted material from all sources (including the Internet). Title should be placed underneath and centralized:

In Author-date method, more than one reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., placed after the year of publication:
